

Dear Coraopolis Borough Resident,

We are pleased to inform you that County Hauling, a Noble Environmental company, has been awarded the contract for residential trash and recycling collection in Coraopolis Borough beginning March 1st, 2025. We look forward to providing Coraopolis with a safe and efficient collection program! Our goal is always to attempt to keep collection days the same, however there are a few streets that will be receiving service for trash and recycling on different days. Please see the attached street listings to determine your regularly scheduled pick-up day. The **first week of recycling will be on Monday March 10th** and will continue every other week after.

The following guidelines apply to all residential trash and recycling collections in the Borough:

- Trash and recycling must be out the night before your collection day, or prior to 6 AM on the day of collection. Containers should be watertight, metal or plastic, with tight fitting covers and handles. Each container should not exceed 96 gallons; each plastic bag should not exceed 40 pounds.
- All trash containers, as well as bulk items, must be within five feet of the curb (or five feet from the edge of a traveled road) and placed so as not to interfere with the collection of other items, block the right of way or obstruct traffic. Items not visible or otherwise obstructed from view will not be collected.
- All trash **MUST BE BAGGED** before being placed in the trash can. Loose trash is a potential health hazard for our employees and is more difficult to collect and is a major factor in municipal litter. There will be a limit of fifteen (15) bags of trash per week per home. **DO NOT USE GROCERY BAGS, PAPER BAGS, CARDBOARD BOXES OR 55-GALLON DRUMS AS GARBAGE RECEPTACLES.**
- Please **DO NOT BAG your recycling**, it should be placed in the container loose. If you are placing loose cardboard out for recycling, please flatten all boxes and stack them neatly next to your recycling container. There is no limit on the amount of recycling collected each recycling week.
- There will be a limit of one (1) bulky waste item per week for each household. Bulky Waste includes furniture, appliances such as stoves, washers, dryers, water heaters, other household appliances and furnace pipes. Appliances that contain refrigerants must have a tag attached certifying that the refrigerant has been removed, this includes refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, ice makers and water coolers.
- For our workers' protection mattresses and box springs must be wrapped in plastic and taped securely closed with duct or packing tape to prevent any possible exposure to infectious pests such as bedbugs, fleas, etc.
- Place all needles, syringes, and lancets in a hard-plastic container with a tight-fitting lid taped shut. Wrap all sharp objects, such as broken glass or sharp metal, in heavy paper and tape shut. Please protect our workers!
- Construction and demolition waste materials will not be accepted as part of your weekly trash services. Carpeting will be accepted as long as it is rolled and cut into lengths of four (4) feet or less.
- Coraopolis Borough residents are eligible to receive scheduled collection of electronic and household hazardous waste at no additional cost. - See the attached calendar for the Holiday collection schedule. If a holiday falls on a weekday, collection is pushed back one day for all the days that follow.

Glass is back!! Clear, brown, blue, and green glass food and beverage containers or jars will be accepted in your recycling containers.

Types 3-7 Plastics are no longer recyclable. There is no market for this material, so if it ends up in the recycling, it will be trucked to the recycling plant, then sorted and trucked to the landfill. The best way to reduce the carbon footprint of each item is to follow these guidelines closely and be sure to reach out to our Customer Service if you have any questions!

The two types of plastic that are still recyclable are **Types 1 & 2**, which are among the most common. Examples of Type 1 include soda, water, salad dressing and cooking oil bottles (either bottles you drink from, or that hold consumables). Some examples of Type 2 include milk and juice jugs, shampoo, conditioner or bodywash bottles and laundry detergents containers. Neither of these lists are comprehensive, so be sure to check each container for the recycling logo and the codes PET or PETE for Type 1 and PEHD or HDPE for Type 2. If the container has any of these codes, it is recyclable. If it does not, then it is not recyclable.
